WWI Centenary

Historic Ryde Society is planning to mark the centenary of WWI with a joint display curated by volunteers working with Ryde Town Council, and a group of local collectors of Isle of Wight Rifles memorabilia.

Gloria's experience and charm when dealing with all walks of society was very welcome during the first Royal visit to the Heritage Centre in July 2012, when HRS Prince Richard, the Duke of Gloucester, came to open the extension in the basement. Simon Tidd, the Duke's equerry, subsequently wrote a letter of thanks, saying how much the Duke had enjoyed his visit, which is now on show.

It is expected that the IW Rifles display will be opened in June, and the WWI display later in the summer. If anyone has anything of interest relating to WWI which they would be willing to loan to the Centre, please get in touch via 01983 717435. All such items will be covered by the Society's insurance, and displayed in locked cases, so you can rest assured they will be well looked after.

The Community Book project - This ten week project has now been running for four weeks. Led by children's author, Philip Bell, of Beachy Books, the project will result in ten copies of a book about Ryde being given to the Society. It is then up to the Society to publish further copies if so desired.

To date, six volunteers have become involved, but it's something which people can dip in and out of, so, if you're feeling so inclined, pop along at 0930 on a Friday morning and find out what it's all about. There will be no workshop during half-term week on Friday, May 30.

The book will have three new walking trails around Ryde with details of historical interest along the way. One will lead along Spencer Road and back along Queen's Road; the second comes up Union and High Streets, and proceeds through Vernon Square and down George Street; the third leads along the Esplanade, up East Hill Road, and back through Appley, North Walk and the seafront.

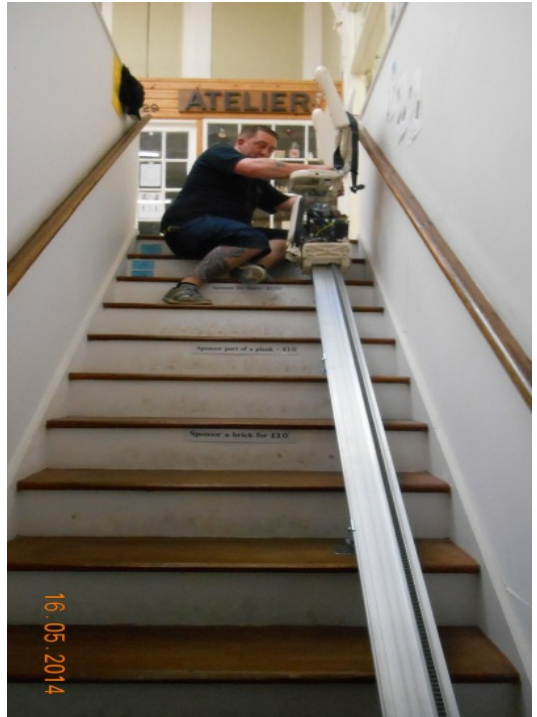

The Stairlift - Historic Ryde Society was given a grant from the Community Development Foundation to install a stairlift in the Royal Victoria Arcade, to encourage more people to come down into the basement and immerse themselves in Ryde's history. The great day arrived, and the stairlift was installed on May 16. All the volunteers had a spin up and back down the stairs - it's honestly by far the easiest way of finding out exactly how it works! - and the following day it was first used by a member of the public, who declared it 'A very smooth ride. Much better than my doctor's!'
